What is a Non-Traditional Instruction Day?

A Non-Traditional School Day is a method of delivering instruction for ALL students on a day when school buildings are not accessible due to unforeseen circumstances (i.e., snow days). Teachers have the opportunity to maintain an online presence for content delivery or provide a hard copy of work for students without technology or network resources. The result is decreased loss of instructional time and an increased ability to continue learning content.

Will every day school is cancelled due to an unexpected event be used as an NTID?

No, every cancelled school day will NOT be an NTI day.

How will I know when the district is using an NTID?

School cancellation announcements will clearly identify NTI days.

How will student submit their work on these days?

All K through Grade 7 students will receive a special envelope to keep and return any required written work. Students working electronically will receive directions from their respective teachers for work submissions.

What happens if my child misplaces his or her NTID lesson/folder?

Each school operates a Help Desk during NTI days. Parents and Students may call the Main Office at each school for assistance.
